### Nourish Christian people with the food of truth

VATICAN CITY, JUN 1, 2006 (VIS) - The Holy Father today received participants in the third meeting of the 11th ordinary council of the Secretariat General of the Synod of Bishops. They, under the leadership of Archbishop Nikola Eterovic, are gathering and organizing the proposals that emerged from the last synod, held in October 2005 on the theme, "The Eucharist: source and summit of the life and mission of the Church."

"Today's meeting," the Holy Father told them, "is an appropriate occasion to emphasize once more the importance of charity in the activities of the pastors of the Church. ... Nourishing the Lord's flock is a ministry of watchful love that calls for total dedication, complete commitment of energy and, if necessary, the sacrifice of life. The Eucharist is, above all, the source and the hidden permanent impulse of our mission."

He went on: "In his ecclesial existence, the bishop represents the image of Christ Who nourishes us with His flesh and His blood. From the Eucharist, the pastor draws the strength to exercise that special pastoral charity which consists in dispensing the food of truth to Christian people."

"The truth of Love cannot be silenced, because it is the very essence of God. Preaching it from the rooftops is not just 'amoris officium' but a vital message for mankind in all times. The truth of evangelical love concerns all men, and all of man, and compels the pastor to proclaim it without fear or reticence, never yielding to the conditioning of the world."

The Pope concluded his brief remarks by reminding

bishops that, "in a time such as our own, characterized by the growing phenomenon of globalization, it becomes ever more necessary to bring the truth of Christ and His Gospel of salvation to everyone vigorously and clearly. There are innumerable areas in which to proclaim and lovingly bear witness to the truth: so many people are hungry and cannot be left to languish without sustenance."

### Why does the Left Hate the Pope? – Chris Manion

John Paul was not right or left. He was for life against death. This especially vexed advocates of abortion, homosexuality, and sexual decadence in general. Advocates of "women's rights" fumed when millions flocked to embrace our Lady as their model of the Catholic woman. Nominal "Catholics" advocating abortion relentlessly refused to address the pain felt by the dying unborn child, or, for that matter, the fate of its eternal soul.

As with the Communists, their intellectual comrades-in-arms, this is logical: If there's life after death, then there is life before birth. And that is a truth they must constantly deny... When asked about life after death, Karl Marx replied, "A good socialist does not ask that question." In fact, such forbidden questions abound on the left.

And so does vitriol. From Marx and Lenin to Stalin, Mao, and the Sandinistas, leftists have always saved their most profound hatred not for the capitalists — after all, they were doomed by the "forces of history" — but for their real enemies, their compassionate competitors who have a non-ideological, non-abstract love for the poor, the oppressed, the marginalized, the suffering.

The left and the secular media are of one voice in viewing the Church as a struggle between "left" and "right." Will the next Pope be a "progressive"? Will he allow women priests, ease up on divorce, welcome home alienated homosexuals, and understand that abortion is just a part of life? ...For them, the Church — like every other human institution — is only about power: their power. If it doesn't serve the revolution, the dialectic requires that it be either co-opted or destroyed. Leftists squirm and scream because, while they have been quite successful in co-opting various "Catholic" individuals and institutions, the Pope always betrays them in the end. They have allied with Satan against Holy Mother Church, but even the gates of Hell cannot prevail against her. Thus their hatred. It's logical. — *The Wanderer*, 21/4/05
