H1N1 Preventive Measures

As directed by the Archbishop of Toronto, the following preventive measures in relation to the H1N1 Flu Virus will be implemented immediately in our parish until further notice:

- Temporary suspension of communion from the chalice.
- Temporary suspension of communion on the tongue.
- Refrain from shaking hands during the sign of peace. A nod, bow, smile or other appropriate gestures are encouraged.
- All those distributing communion are asked to wash their hands before mass. An alcohol-based sanitizer is being provided so that all ministers may sanitize their hands before and after distributing communion.
- Parishioners who are feeling sick or ill, are advised to stay home.
- Hand sanitizing stations are now available near the church entrance doors.

Be assured that these are temporary measures only, intended to protect and care for our most vulnerable brothers and sisters.
