Pope's Intentions for June

General: That every national and transnational institution may strive to guarantee respect for human life from conception to natural death;

Mission:

That the Churches in Asia, which constitute a "little flock" among non-Christian populations, may know how to communicate the Gospel and give joyful witness to their adherence to Christ.

This Sunday is the start of Ordinary Time

In his apostolic letter approving the Roman calendar, Pope Paul VI noted some important facts about the liturgical year:

- ▲ Over many centuries, Catholics had become accustomed to so many special religious devotions that the mysteries of redemption lost their proper place. This was due to the large number of vigils, holydays and octaves, and to the growing dominance of various seasons over the Church year;
- ▲ St. Pius X and Pope John XXIII restored Sunday to its former dignity, so that everyone should once more consider it as the church's original feast day;
- ▲ The popes restated the traditional teaching of the Church: The celebration of the liturgical year has a special sacramental power and force which nourishes and strengthens the life of Christians. The Church year is not merely a recalling of the historical events by which Christ won our salvation;
- ▲ The reason for the restoration of the liturgical year is to help believers through their faith, hope and love to share more fully in the entire mystery of Christ as it is unfolding throughout the year.

Reminder: Parish Assembly Today

As announced, all parishioners are invited and highly encouraged to **attend the Parish Assembly today, May 30th at 2:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall.** The Council's Constitution and By-Laws will be ratified. The Elections will no longer take place as the nominations were just enough to fill the number of new members needed to complete the council. Thus, the new members of the Parish Pastoral Council will be acclaimed and presented to the parishioners during the Parish Assembly. Please be there.

Catholic Education "Sign Up Sunday"

The Archbishop of Toronto has designated next weekend, **June 5-6 as "Sign Up Sunday" for Catholic Education in the Archdiocese of Toronto.** We invite all parishioners to designate their support of the Catholic school system on their property tax assessment. Our parish lies within the boundaries of Toronto Catholic District School Board. You may not be aware that if you move, your assessment status defaults to that of a public school ratepayer. Your support helps maintain an accurate registry of Catholic ratepayers, determine the number of Catholic Trustees to govern our schools, and most importantly, allows you to participate in the voting process to elect School Board Trustees. The next election will take place this October in municipalities throughout the Archdiocese.

The Sign Up Forms will be made available for those who have moved and have not updated their assessment status or for those who are unsure of their current status. Pick up your forms at the back of the church next weekend.
