## The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Feast: August 15

This day is a religious Holy Day  
of obligation.



According to the Roman Catholic doctrine, “Finally *the Immaculate Virgin* preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, **was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven**, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death. The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son’s Resurrection, and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians.” This doctrine was dogmatically and infallibly defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950 in his Apostolic Constitution *Munificentissimus Deus*.
